#### January Program: Becky Goldsmith

Our January speaker is Becky Goldsmith of Piece O'Cake Quilts. Many of us have admired Becky's quilts over the years. What a treat it will be to hear Becky speak and show us some of her quilts. Her topic will be, "My Quilt Top is Finished—Now What?" She will take us through the process of making decisions about batting, backing, quilting (yourself or quilt-by-check), quilting thread and designs, marking quilts...and SO much more! Becky has a real passion for this topic and it is one of her most often requested lectures. Be sure to have a pen and paper handy when you log into this Zoom meeting. You may want to take notes!

Becky Goldsmith is an award-winning quilter who travels to teach quilting both nationally and internationally. Her classes are always interesting and informative, with an emphasis on teaching techniques that help you improve your sewing skills without making you crazy.

Becky met Linda Jenkins, her partner in Piece O'Cake Designs, at a meeting of the Green Country Quilters' Guild in Tulsa, OK in 1986. They started Piece O'Cake in 1994 and, since then, have published more than 30 books and hundreds of patterns, including 7 Blocks of the Month. Linda is mostly retired now while Becky continues writing books and patterns.

Becky says that, for all of us, making quilts is interesting, fulfilling, and challenging—and that being a member of the quilting community is an added bonus. She never imagined that being a quilter would become her life's work, but she's so happy that it did!

# UFO CHALLENGE 2020... Oops! Now 2021

So it's 2021; and for the March general guild meeting, we will have our UFO reveals, finally !!!! If you are interested in taking part in the reveal, you are asked to mail your \$3.00 entry fee to Westside Quilters Guild at PO Box 1036, North Plains Or 97133 – payable to WQG. We do not need your list of projects this year. This is \$3 total, not per entry.

UFOs are "unfinished projects". This year's UFO Challenge will include your quilting creations and anything we've had classes or workshops for – quilts, wallets and bags are UFOs – anything quilting related. Only started projects qualify - if you have the fabric, but hadn't started yet, it doesn't qualify for



the challenge. And, they must be completed projects – quilted, binding done and a label on the back.

It seems everything we are doing has some COVID attachment to it, and the UFO Challenge is no different. We have all been working hard in our sewing and quilting arena and have finished many projects. Although we would love to see each and every one of your creations, we do have to place a limit on what is shown during the meeting. You can pick "3" of your favorites, your most challenging, your "most whatever" you like and email a picture of each of those to Jane Hogue at <a href="mailto:ihogue.or@gmail.com">ihogue.or@gmail.com</a>. The deadline for submitting your photos is Friday, March 12<sup>th</sup>. We are again doing this by Power Point, and Jane has agreed to create our presentation. (THANK YOU, THANK YOU JANE!) Jane will create a numbered list of participants, and that will be emailed to you prior to the meeting. During the presentation, be sure to watch for your place and be ready to un-mute and talk about your entries.

Patty Dobbs, our leader for this event, will also have the list of entries. There will be prizes awarded and announced after the presentation. The number of prizes and the amount of each prize will be determined by the number of entries for this reveal – the prizes come from the total of the \$3.00 entry fees paid. #### Tech News & Tips—Changing Your Screen Name

When you sign into Zoom, you can change your user name so that we all "know" who we are seeing on screen. This also helps our membership team note who is in attendance, just as we do during our in person meetings. If you are bound and determined to keep your unidentifiable name, please use the chat function in Zoom or email Chase to let her know who you are!

If you are using Zoom on a desktop or laptop computer, move your mouse to the three dots in the upper right corner, select "rename" and type in your name (first name is fine, first name and last initial if you're one of many with the same first name). If you are using Zoom on an iPhone or iPad, you will need to tap on "Participants" at the bottom of the screen, then tap on your name and type in the correct info. This process will work once you've entered our meeting. If you want to change it for all meetings, you may change it in your Zoom account.

If you are using another device that I haven't covered, the directions may still be the same. Do a search for "how to rename in Zoom on (your device type)" for the exact instructions.

We are all learning more about Zoom every time we have a meeting! If you have questions or suggestions, please feel free to email me or our guild president, Judy Block, and let us know.






# **Education Corner—Quilt Stories for Children**

This month's survey is brought to you by our members with first names starting with O—Z, plus some WQG Board members. Thanks to all who responded.

Survey Question: What was your best quilty accomplishment in 2020? What are your quilty goals/resolutions for 2021?

- Patty Weightman: I was commissioned to make a memory quilt for a lady I met on a plane! I completed it early in 2020. She sent me a box of "stuff" with just a note of what was grand-mother's, grandfather's, daughter's, hers & her sister's. Literally, just pieces of "stuff". Mailed it to her east coast home, even though she was stuck in California when the lock down happened. Months later, when she finally got home to open the box, I received the nicest note. She wrote that she wanted to call, but she becomes so overwhelmed & cries whenever she looks or talks about it!
  - I don't really do resolutions. Just gonna try to keep myself & family healthy & happy! Looking forward to getting together with friends again. Looking forward to a better year. Just generally looking forward!
- **Sue Nichols**: My greatest quilty accomplishment in 2020 was delivering 37 quilts to a long armer in Stayton OR who was collecting for those who were burned out in the terrible fires in Oregon this year, These came from both a group of friends who meet weekly at my home (until March of 2020) and my own collection. They collected over 3000!!
  - For 2021, I want to do a large Judy Niemeyer for my queen bed. Feel more confident after doing her workshop.
- JudyQ Block: I am most excited about the photo journal Power Point that I created as a visual documentation of the quilts that I have made since I began quilting in 1972 (with the exception of those given away prior to photographing them..) This is an ever growing project, including current works. Many of the photos were taken out of doors amongst nature, which adds, I think, to the memories. - Christina Todd: My best quilty accomplishment in 2020 was completing a Joyce Gieszler mystery quilt top from 2018. Would not have accomplished this without my quilty friend, Sharon! (Editor's Note: My pleasure, Tina! It was fun sewing with you.)
- Ruth Voelker: I must say that my best quilty accomplishment was creating a quilt for a cousin with his grandmother's hand embroidered squares. I chose the pattern, pieced it and completed the quilt by free-motion quilting it on my domestic machine; something I hadn't tackled on a large quilt before. By the end of the year, I took great satisfaction in knowing that I have worked on and completed so many fun items quilt tops, little mini zipper bags, wall hangings and pillows with catchy phrases, free standing lace embroidered ornaments for family and friends, table runners, and a photo collage still in progress. This enthusiasm for creating things from fabric is what has helped keep me motivated, has brought me joy and has helped keep me connected to many of my wonderful friends throughout a very difficult year for all of us.
  - I'm not a big resolutions person, but I want to continue to challenge myself to learn something new, work steadily through my 40+ works in progress, get several quilt tops quilted so I can use them, and not the least of all, empty a few stored fabric bins. Should keep me out of trouble for a while, eh?

Paulina Kriebel: I have only made a few large quilts in the last 18 years—too busy with my
wearable art business. Covid 19 shut that down; and from May until now, I made over 40 large
quilts—mostly bed/queen sized.


